

# amigurumi penguin



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Amigurumi are typically worked in tight rows of single crochet. The rows are not joined to avoid a seam, but are worked in a spiral and counted with the help of a removable stitch marker.

## Abbreviations

ch.....chain  
dec..... decrease (aka sc 2 tog)  
inc .....increase (aka 2 sc in 1 stitch)  
sc ..... single crochet  
sl st.....slip stitch  
tog.....together  
dc..... double crochet

## HEAD

- Row 1: with black ch 2, 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook.  
Row 2: inc in each sc (12)  
Row 3: \* sc in next sc, inc \* around (18)  
Row 4: \* sc in each of the next 2 sc, inc \* around (24)  
Row 5: \* sc in each of the next 3 sc, inc\* around (30)  
Row 6: \* sc in each of the next 4 sc, inc\* around (36)  
Row 7: \* sc in each sc\* around (36)  
Row 8: \* sc in each sc\* around (36)  
Row 9: \* sc in each sc\* around (36)  
Row 10: \* dec, sc in each of the next 4 sc\* around (30)  
Row 11: \* dec, sc in each of the next 3 sc\* around (24)  
Row 12: \* dec, sc in each of the next 2 sc\* around (18)

## EYE PATCHES (make 2)

- Row 1: with white ch 2, 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook this time *do join* with a sl st  
Row 2: ch 3, 2 dc in same sc as joining, \*2 dc in next ch, 3 dc in next ch\* around join with a sl st. Fasten off.

## BEAK

- Row 1: with black ch 2, 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook  
Rows 2-5: \*sc in each sc\* around

## BODY

- Rows 1-4: same as rows 1-4 for the head (24)  
Rows 5-13: sc in each sc for 9 rounds (24)  
Row 14: \*dec, sc in each of the next 2 sc\* (18)

Rows 15-16: \*sc in each sc\* (18). Fasten off leaving an end for sewing.

Stuff the head and the body firmly and attach with the help of a tapestry needle.





### BELLY

**Row 1:** with white ch 7, 2 dc in 4<sup>th</sup> ch from hook, dc in each of the next 2 ch, 6 dc in the last ch. Working on the opposite side of the foundation chain, dc in each of the next 2 ch, 3 dc in the last ch. Join with a sl st. Fasten off.

**Row 2:** with gray join in any stitch. 2 dc in each of the end dc's and only 1 dc in each of the other dc's. (see picture)  
Sew on to body.

### WINGS (make 2)

**Row 1:** with black ch 2, 4 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook

**Row 2:** \*2 sc in each sc\* around (8)

**Row 3:** \* inc, sc in each of the next 3 sc\* 2 times (10)

**Row 4:** \* inc, sc in each of the next 4 sc\* 2 times (12)

**Row 5:** \* inc, sc in each of the next 5 sc\* 2 times (14)

**Row 6:** \* sc in each sc\* around (14)

**Row 7:** \* inc, sc in each of the next 6 sc\* 2 times (16)

**Rows 8-9:** \*sc in each sc\* around (16)

**Row 10:** \* inc, sc in each of the next 7 sc\* 2 times (18)

**Rows 11-13:** \*sc in each sc\* around (18)

**Row 14:** \* dec, sc in each of the next 7 sc\* 2 times (16)

**Row 15:** \* dec, sc in each of the next 6 sc\* 2 times (14)

Fasten off. Do not stuff wings. Flatten and attach symmetrically to the body.



### FEET (make 2)

The feet are done in 2 parts, which are attached together later. If this is too hard, you can do just Part 2.

#### Part 1

**Row 1:** with black ch 2, 6 sc in 2<sup>nd</sup> ch from hook (6)

**Row 2:** \*inc in each sc\* around (12). Fasten off.

#### Part 2

**Rows 1-2:** do the same as rows 1-2 in Part 1, but with gray. Do not fasten off.

**Row 3:** holding Parts 1 and 2 wrong sides together, insert hook in next gray sc and the corresponding sc on the black, and complete a sc (see photo). Repeat around.

**Row 4:** \*sc, ch 3, sc\* in the next ch; \*sc, ch 4, sc\* in the next ch; \*sc, ch 3, sc\* in the next ch, sl st. Fasten off.

Attach feet to the body with the black parts facing down.
